Member, and Chief Clerk, Mike Grabecki shares his progress through June 2025 his Work Train build. Looks great Mike!








My Friend, and the Dean Freytag Award

Not everybody knows about the NMRA's Special Interest Groups, commonly called SIGs. They are precisely what the name implies: <u>Special Interest Groups</u> are groups of people that have an interest in areas like Operations, Layout Design, Civil War, and Steel Mills, to name a few. I am a member of Operations SIG and Steel Mills SIG. As a member of the Steel Mill Group, I have met some excellent modelers and seen some incredible layouts. Some of the layouts are just a Steel Mill in itself. There are numerous train movements in a mill, allowing for a wide range of operations on this type of layout.

Jim Herak is also a member of the Steel Mill SIG, and we have become great friends. We spent many hours discussing and touring the Steel Mills. Jim worked in the Steel Mill industry for most of his life, accumulating a wealth of knowledge in the field. He is also a great modeler. He and I took a trip to Cleveland to show me the Mills that were there during the heyday of steel making and the railroads that connected them. What a fantastic, guided tour I had.





Jim was just featured in the Steel Mill SIG Journal, where he was awarded the Dean Freytag Award for the Best Model as presented in Photographs. When you see the size of this model, you will realize why it was the *Best Model as presented in Photographs*.

Below is the history of Jim's Layout and Model as told by him.

Consolidated Steel Company

Consolidated Steel Company is a fictitious entity on an O-gauge high rail layout constructed by modeler Jim Herak. The blast furnace modeled herein is based on plans obtained from Mike Rabbitt, the source of many steel mill drawings. The drawings, in HO scale (3.5 mm to a foot), were characterized as blast furnaces typically constructed in the US,

The height of the furnace is 64 inches, or 256 scale feet. Materials used in the model included styrene, PVC pipe, ABS pipe, bass wood, plywood, Mason board, construction paper, and paper-board. A number of Plastruct fittings were also used. The footprint of the model, excluding rail-road approaches, is 10 ft x 3 ft. The entire area the layout is 270 square feet.

The layout includes a slag processing plant, a coke plant, an open hearth furnace shop, a forge shop, a scrap processing facility, and an oil refinery. All of these facilities are significantly

considered the "Father of Steel Mill Modeling." Dean worked with Walthers to help produce "The Works." A Steel Mill series was introduced in 1996, and a second series was introduced somewhere around 2010.

of

"compressed" to accommodate the limited space available for the layout. The railroad serving these facilities is the Terminal Railway, also a fictitious name.

The name, "Central Furnace," is derived from a facility that existed on the Cuyahoga River in Cleveland, OH. In 1881, the Cleveland Rolling Mill Company established a blast furnace plant on the river and a steel works in near-by Newburgh Heights. Over the next 30 years, four blast furnaces were constructed, the most modern one in 1911. During that time, several mergers absorbed the facility, and it was eventually acquired and operated by US Steel. During the depression, two of the oldest furnaces (1881-1883) and the steel works were closed and scrapped out. The two remaining furnaces became a merchant pig iron plant serving foundry customers, especially Ford Motor Co. and Valley Mould Co., both located in the Cleveland area.

Sometime in the early 50s, the oldest blast furnace was demolished, leaving the 1911 furnace intact, and in 1954, a new furnace was constructed. The facility was still a merchant pig iron plant. During the 60s and competitiveness of the plant. In 1974, the 1911 furnace was blown out, leaving the 1954 furnace operational. At the time, the facility was known as "Central Furnace." In September-October of 1978, the 24-year-old "Central Furnace" was blown out, and the facility was entirely shut down.


In April 1978, however, the last operational furnace was the site of filming the blast furnace scene for the movie "The Deer Hunter."

Sometime in the 80s, the facility was demolished, probably about the same time as the US Steel Ohio Works in Youngstown, OH, was demolished.

The short history above is credited to the Historic American Engineering Record, dated 1979.

Ops Ops Ops Part 2

The date for the Beginners Operating Session (BOS) has been set for Saturday and Sunday, November 1st and 2nd. We also have the layouts you will be operating on, which have been selected (more on that later). What we need to know now is who plans to attend and operate at the BOS.

There will be four (4) operating sessions as follows:

BOS Saturday A - 12:00 to 2:00

BOS Saturday B – 3:30 to 5:30

BOS Sunday A - 12:00 to 2:00

BOS Sunday B - 3:30 to 5:30



If you wish to attend one or more BOS, please send me an email (gar2rey@gmail.com) with "Ops Ops Ops" in the subject line (this is so my spam detector does not accidentally throw out your email) and I will keep you informed via email. Also, when you email me, let me know which BOS time session(s) you would like to attend. Remember, you can attend one, two, three, or all four sessions.

Please submit your preferred session request(s) to me by October 20 at the above email.

Remember, each layout is different, and the owner can only accommodate a specific number of operators. I will pair up the operators, the layout, and the times once I have all the data. I will then email you all the information as to when and where you will be operating.

Also note that there will be five BOS sessions (two in Hamburg, two in Amherst, and one in North Tonawanda). This implies that at one or more times, two sessions will be running simultaneously. A general note of interest is that the BOS are being held one week after Frank Pastore's layout tours on Saturday and Sunday, October 25/26, 2025, so you may want to visit them if you are planning to join the BOS the following week.

Ops Ops Ops Part 2 (continued)

Operator Guidelines:

- 1. Remember, you are a guest, be mindful and considerate during your visit.
- 2. Respect the Owner's Rules- every layout owner has their own set of rules, either based on a specific code or common sense. These should be respected and followed.
- 3. Safety First- this includes proper equipment handling, adhering to speed limits, and understanding how to operate switches and signals.
- 4. Prototypical Operation- strive for realistic train movements. This includes using prototypical speeds for different types of trains (e.g., slower in yards, faster on mainlines) and making realistic starts and stops.
- 5. Proper Communication- if the layout uses a dispatching system, understand how to communicate with the dispatcher and follow their instructions.
- 6. Handle Equipment Carefully- avoid touching locomotives or other equipment without permission. When handling rolling stock, be mindful of how you couple and uncouple cars.
- 7. Have Fun- model railroading should be an enjoyable experience. Be respectful of other operators and contribute to a positive operating session.

Layout Owners Guidelines:

- 1. Prepare the Layout- have a clean and tidy layout room to create a pleasant operating/ working environment.
- 2. Make sure everything works- test locomotives to ensure they are operational, clean locomotive wheels and track.
- 3. Prepare Documentation for each Train- give starting and ending location, route, industries served, etc.; can be condensed to a single card.
- 4. Welcome Operators- remember these individuals are not experienced. Take a few minutes to discuss your operating principles and the documentation you use.
- 5. Explain Layout Rules- how to uncouple cars, how to throw switches, and how to use a throttle. Have experienced operators on hand to assist new operators.
